Expressive Arts and Design

We will be learning different creative skills including painting, printing and joining.

Imaginative play and role play will be developed through our home role play and small world area.

Physical

Moving in different ways through their favourite parts of the outdoor equipment. Ball skills – rolling, throwing and catching. Gross motor skills to draw lines and circles. Squiggle whilst you wiggle, Doh gym.
Fine motor skills – threading cotton reels and small beads, mark making skills using paint, water, pencils and crayons.

Putting on clothes with the support of an adult.
